



Cole G being creative making a flower for Science at home.

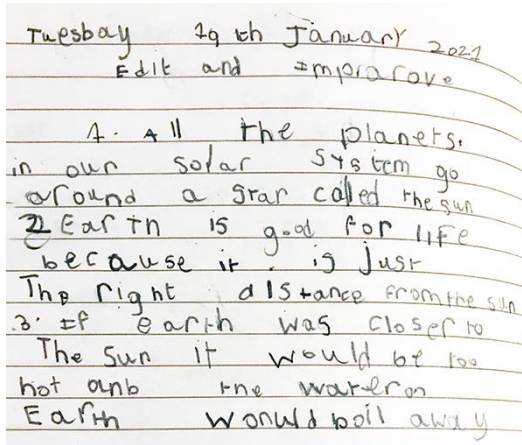

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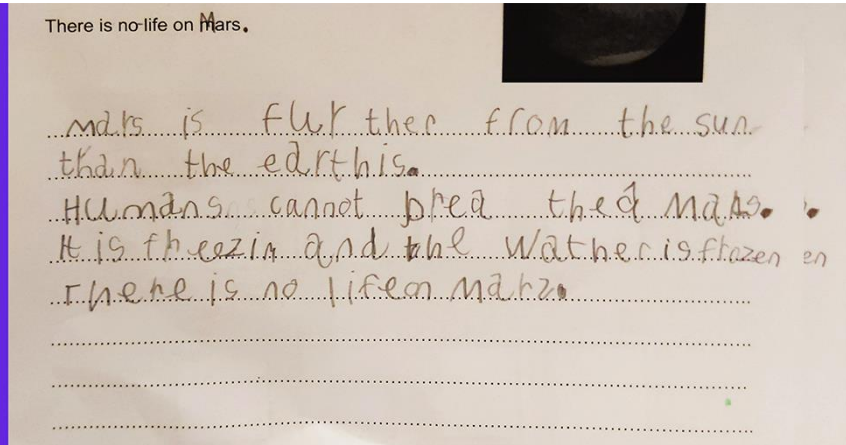
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Y2 Nightingales - Lilly F and Sonny H . More fantastic writing from our kids really trying hard at developing this important basic skill. Great! Well done.
