

Assessment Criteria

Mathematics Stage 4 (Year 4)

Place Value	1. Count in multiples of 6, 7, 9, 25 and 1000.
	2. Find 1000 more or less than a given number.
	2b. Round any number to the nearest 10, 100 or 1000.
	3. Count backwards through zero to include negative numbers.
	4. Recognise the place value of each digit in a 4-digit number (thousands, hundreds, tens, and ones).
	4b. Order and compare numbers beyond 1000.
Add and Sub	5. Read Roman numerals to 100 (I to C) and know that over time, the numeral system changed to include the concept of zero and place value.
	6. Add numbers with up to 4 digits using the formal written methods of columnar addition.
	6b. Subtract numbers with up to 4 digits using the formal written methods of columnar subtraction.
	6c. Add and subtract numbers mentally including 4 digit number and 1's, 10's, 100's, 1000's.
	7. Estimate and use inverse operations to check answers to a calculation.
Mult and Divide	8. Solve addition and subtraction two-step problems in contexts, deciding which operations and methods to use and why.
	9. Recall multiplication and division facts for multiplication tables up to 12×12 .
	10. Recognise and use factor pairs and commutativity in mental calculations.
	11. Multiply two-digit numbers by a one-digit number using formal written layout.
	11b. Multiply three-digit numbers by a one-digit number using formal written layout.
Fractions	12. Solve probs involving \times and $+$, inc. using the distributive law to mult 2 digit nos by 1 digit, integer scaling probs and harder correspondence probs such as n objects are connected to m objects.
	13. Recognise and show, using diagrams, families of common equivalent fractions.
	14. Count up and down in hundredths.
	14b. Recognise that hundredths arise when dividing an object by a hundred and dividing tenths by ten.
	15. Add fractions with the same denominator.
	15b. Subtract fractions with the same denominator.
	16. Recognise and write decimal equivalents of any number of tenths or hundredths;
	16b. Recognise and write decimal equivalents to $\frac{1}{4}$, $\frac{1}{2}$ and three quarters.
	17. Find the effect of dividing a one- or two-digit number by 10 and 100, identifying the value of the digits in the answer as ones, tenths and hundredths.
MEASURE	18. Round decimals with one decimal place to the nearest whole number.
	18b. Solve simple measure and money problems involving fractions and decimals to 2 decimal places.
	19. Convert between different units of measure (e.g. kilometre to metre).
	19b. Solve problems involving converting from hours to minutes; minutes to seconds; years to months; weeks to days).
	20. Measure and calculate the perimeter of a rectilinear figure (including squares) in centimetres and metres.
	20b. Find the area of rectilinear shapes by counting squares.
GEOMETRY	21. Estimate, compare and calculate different measures, including money in pounds and pence.
	22. Read, write and convert time between analogue and digital 12 and 24-hour clocks.
	23. Compare and classify geometric shapes, including quadrilaterals, based on their properties and sizes.
	23b. Compare and classify geometric shapes, including triangles, based on their properties and sizes.
	24. Identify acute and obtuse angles.
	24b. Compare and order angles up to two right angles by size.
	25. Identify lines of symmetry in 2-D shapes presented in different orientations.
	26. Complete a simple symmetric figure with respect to a specific line of symmetry.
	27. Describe positions on a 2-D grid as coordinates in the first quadrant.
	27b. Describe movements between positions as translations of a given unit to the left/right and up/down.
STATS	28. Plot specified points and draw sides to complete a given polygon.
	29. Interpret discrete and continuous data using appropriate graphical methods, including bar charts and time graphs.
	29b. Present discrete and continuous data using appropriate graphical methods, including bar charts and time graphs
	30. Solve comparison, sum and difference problems using information presented in bar charts, pictograms, tables and other graphs.
